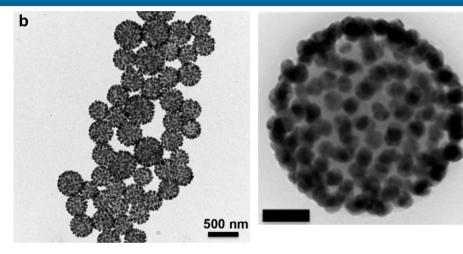

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### **Core-satellite nanostuctures**

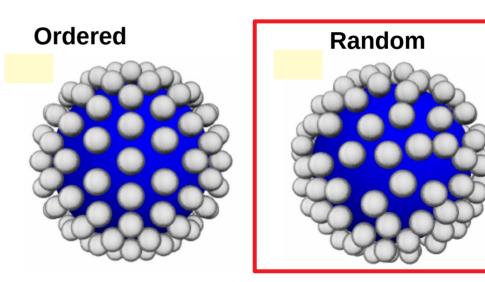


- SiO<sub>2</sub> dielectric core decorated with 40nm silver nanoparticles
- Isotropic, angle independent scattering properties
- Near-field coupling among nanoparticles
- Random or ordered packing

Minimize potential with gradient descent:

$$U(\theta_i, \phi_i) = \sum_{i < j} \sum_{j=1}^{N_p} \frac{1}{d_{ij}}$$

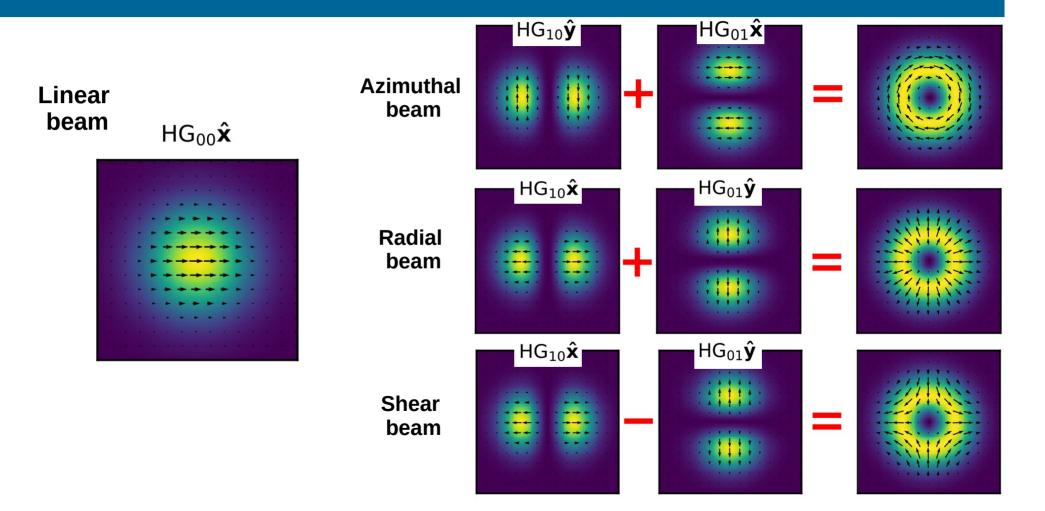
Random positions:  $\phi = U[0, 2\pi]$   $\theta = \cos^{-1} (U[0, 1])$ Prevent nanoparticle

### Multipolar scattering theory

Expansion of the scattered field into vector spherical harmonics (VSH)

$$\boldsymbol{E}_{\text{scat}}(\omega, r, \theta, \phi) = \sum_{l=1}^{\infty} \sum_{m=-l}^{m=l} a_{lm}(\omega) \boldsymbol{N}_{lm} + b_{lm}(\omega) \boldsymbol{M}_{lm}$$

Multipolar decomposition using orthognality of VSHs

$$\oint_{\Omega} N_{lm} \cdot N_{l'm'} d\Omega = \delta_{ll'} \delta_{mm'}$$

$$\oint_{\Omega} M_{lm} \cdot M_{l'm'} d\Omega = \delta_{ll'} \delta_{mm'}$$

$$= \oint_{\Omega} E_{\text{scat}}(\omega, r = r_0, \theta, \phi) \cdot N_{lm}(\omega, r = r_0, \theta, \phi) d\Omega$$

$$\oint_{\Omega} N_{lm} \cdot M_{lm} d\Omega = 0$$

$$= \int_{\Omega} E_{\text{scat}}(\omega, r = r_0, \theta, \phi) \cdot M_{lm}(\omega, r = r_0, \theta, \phi) d\Omega$$

Scattering cross-section per multipolar mode

$$\sigma_{\rm scat}(\omega) = k^2 \sum_{l=1}^{\infty} \sum_{m=-n}^{n} l(l+1) \left( |a_{lm}(\omega)|^2 + |b_{lm}(\omega)|^2 \right)$$

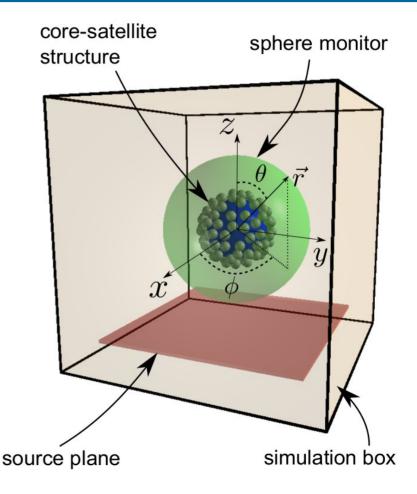
#### **Simulation Setup**

#### **Finite-Difference Time-Domain** method (FDTD) used to compute:

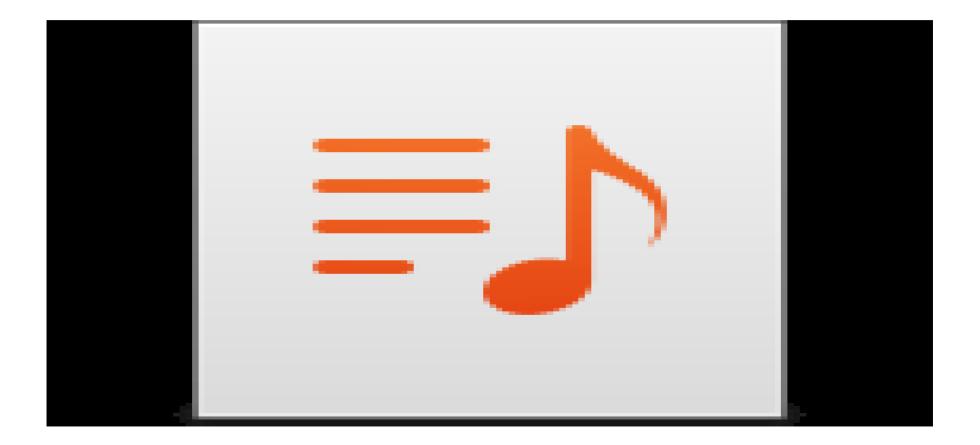
- Scattering cross-section
- Field enhancement
- Displacement currents

**Sphere monitor** collects scattered fields to measure:

- Angular scattering cross-section
- Multipolar scattering
- Multipolar interference effects

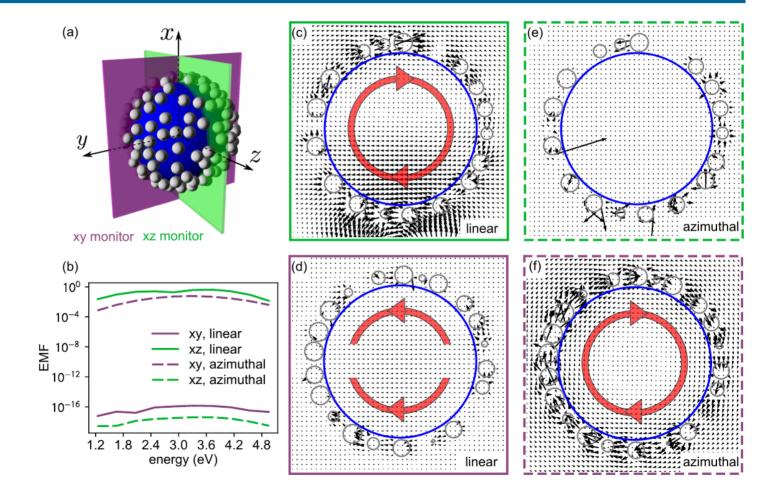
An electromotive force (EMF) drives the displacement currents

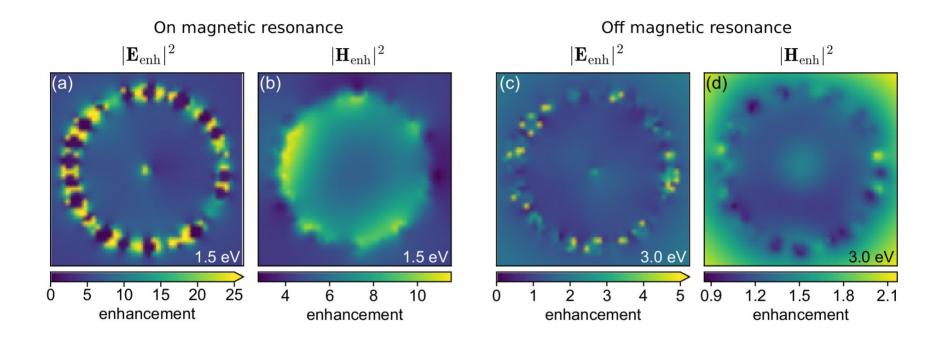
Linear beam EMF in xz plane

**Azimuthal beam** EMF in xy plane

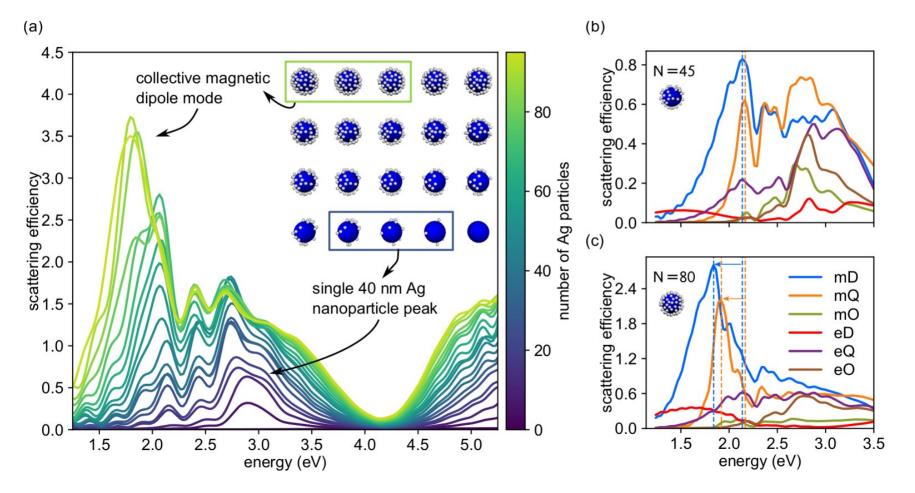
Radial beam No EMF



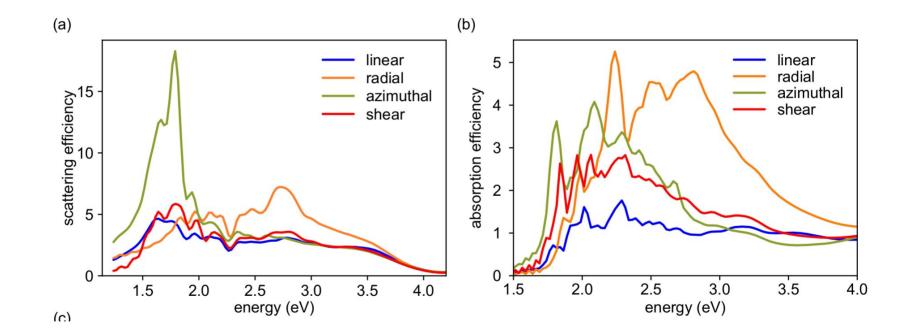

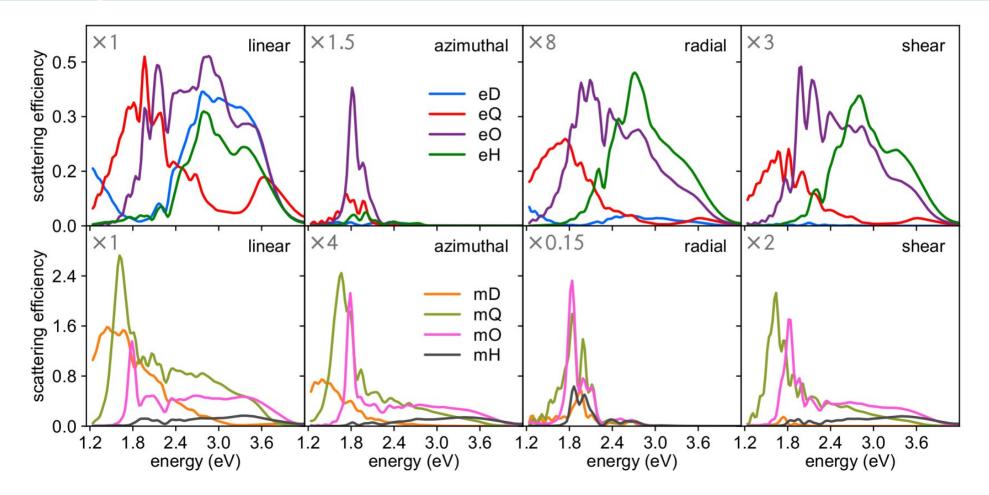

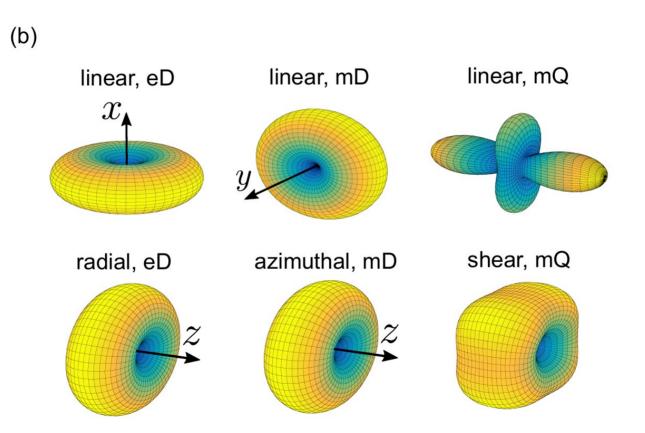

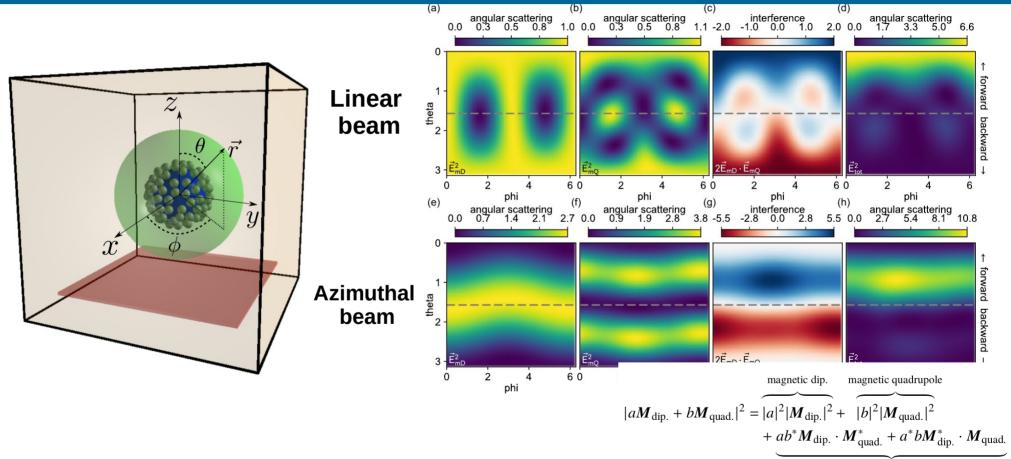
## Vector beams selectively excite and enhance different multipolar modes



# Angular scattering of multipolar modes excited by different vector beams

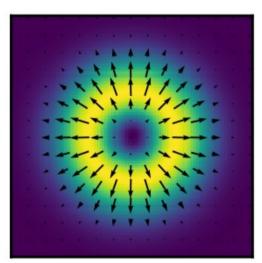


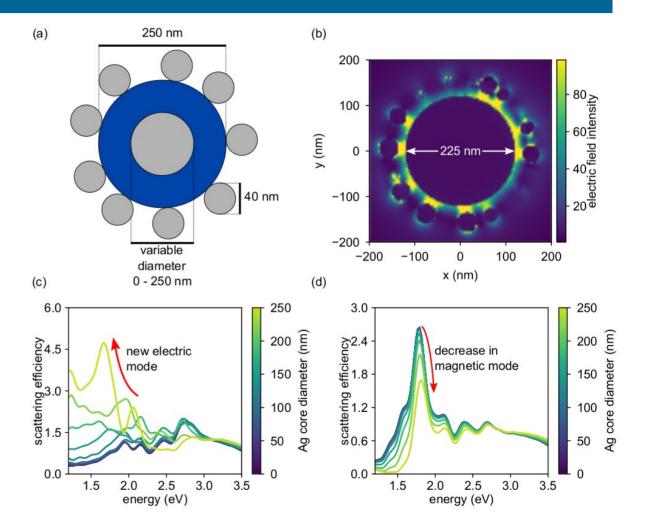
# Magnetic-dipole and magnetic-quadrupole interference in the far-field
